1. Name of Kirkyard: Aultbea Church  
(From HER)

2. National Grid Reference: NG 87544 88556

3. Civil Parish: Gairloch

4. Description: A 19<sup>th</sup> century church in use without a graveyard.

5. Setting: Set in the village of Aultbea on the West Coast of Scotland. The road runs immediately in front of the site to the south. There are houses to the south, west and east, and a field to the north. The nature of the village means that the church setting still feels quite rural.

6. Designations and Significance: There are no redundant buildings or a graveyard at this site. The church was erected in 1889 by J. Hinton Gall and does not appear to have been an earlier ecclesiastical site

Boundary Walls: A wire fence separates the church from the field and a wooden fence separates the church from the house to the west.

Kirk in use: 1889 J. Hinton Gall. Rectangular with projection to west. Door and triple arched window in south gable, with bellcote on top. Buttresses on east and west walls.

8. Ownership of Kirkyard: Church of Scotland Church.
