

## HIGHLAND KIRKYARDS: Ross and Cromarty Pilot Proforma



1. Name of Kirkyard: Logiebride  
(From HER)

2. National Grid Reference: NH 5353 5407

3. Civil Parish: Urquhart and Logie Wester

4. Description: Rural, tree enclosed burial ground near to Conon House. Many 19<sup>th</sup> century gravestones, and some into the start of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The graveyard is roughly rectangular and there are some flat slabs underfoot. It has been used as recently as the 1990s. There is no redundant church or church in use, although it may have been the site of a previous church.

5. Setting: Rural, in woods, close to Conon House. A muddy track skirts the graveyard and walking paths lie in the woods. Conon river is close by and the sound of the river can be heard from the burial ground. The site is built on a small hill.

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6. Designations and Significance: There are no extant structures associated with this burial ground. The graveyard has varied tombstones and is an important part of local history.

### 7. Elements:

Boundary Walls: Collapsed stone rubble walls echoed by a broken chicken wire fence.

Railings, Gates and Gateways: Iron gate entrance way set in wire fence.

Burial Enclosures: Quite a few rusted, incomplete iron railed burial enclosures. One for Christopher MacDonald Esq. with a low stone wall with iron rails broken off in parts.

Another has low, ornate iron railings and is overgrown with ferns, for the meat dresser at Conon House.
