Rathmell Archaeology

Radiometric date now in from SUERC from the Torrachilly Hut Circle, Strathpeffer, excavation for the Forestry Commission.

The dig showed this structure a penannular stone bank, surrounding a hollow, with no evidence of structural post-holes or similar. The preliminary report suggested medieval or post-medieval stock management the most likely - but burnt bone from a hearth/burnt deposit has dated to the early Iron Age (699 to 410 BC). So clearly the site is a lot older, showing the benefit of dating artefact-free sites.
