In the area centred on NC 030 089 are 4 circular stone-walled huts ('A'-'C') within a contemporary field system marked by ruinous walls, stone clearance heaps and occasional slight lynchets

'A' measures 11.5m in diameter between the centres of a wall spread to 2.0m with an entrance gap in the SE  
 Surveyed at 1:2 500.

'B' measures 8.5m in diameter between the centres of a wall spread to 1.5m. There are two gaps; one in the SW and one in the SE, either of which may represent the entrance.

'C', poorly preserved, measures 7.5m between the centres of a wall mutilated by erosion. Entrance not evident  
 Surveyed at 1:10 000.

52 'A fourth hut, also much spread and poorly defined, lies about 50m to the NW of 'b'. (HRA:RBG:24.8.1988).
