52 TEXT

'Immediately W of the S end of Loch Awe, at an elevation of about 200ft. above it, and just above an old enclosure studied with heaps of stones (which do not appear to be of a sepulchral nature) is a cairn, 7ft. to 8ft. high and measuring 63ft N-S by 70ft. transversely; the ground falls away sharply to the E and the extra length of the diameter along this axis may be due to slip. On the top, 15ft. from the N edge, is a depression running S for about 20ft and measuring 10ft. across at its greatest width, and there is another hollow towards the E. Neither of these shows signs of recent excavation. There are some large slabs lying about on the top of the cairn, but there is no sign of either chamber or cist exposed. 'NC 2405 1464. A massive cairn on a N-facing slope 19.5m. N-S by 20.5m. transversely, and 2.5m. high. The adjacent enclosure is an old field wall, and there are, within the area, several small clearance heaps.' (OSFI:R.D.L:2.6.1962)

'NC 2405 1464: Chambered cairn.' (ORDNANCE SURVEY:1967:6"Map) (4)

'No change to the previous reports. There is no evidence of a chamber. Published survey (1:10,000) revised.' (OSFI:N.K.B:1.9.1980)

'The cairn is still 17ft to 8ft. high, but has been much disturbed. On the S side two upright slabs have the appearance of being kerb-stones set some distance within the present edge of the cairn. To the E of them some more or less horizontal slabs suggest the displaced lintels of a passage. These large flat slabs among the smallish stones of the cairn seem to indicate the constructional stones of a chambered cairn, and it may well be that a chamber exists in a fairly complete state.'
