

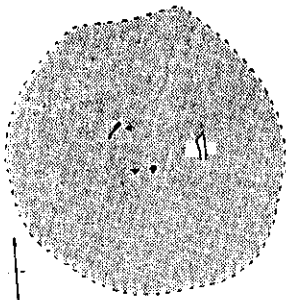

*Description.* This cairn of naked stones, which lies at about 400ft. OD in flat moorland above the Ledmore river, has a diameter of about 55ft. and a height of 6ft. It does not appear to have been much robbed except that the chamber is now roofless. The entrance passage runs from the E side, for a lintel is *in situ* here some 15ft. from the cairn edge. At the centre of the cairn the tops of four large stones, one 4ft. long, can just be seen, and suggest the presence of a polygonal chamber about 8ft. wide. Several other large slabs probably from the roof are lying about.
