The monument known as Ledmore, chambered cairn 900m W of comprises a large circular chambered cairn on low-lying ground near the Ledmore River. The area to be scheduled measures 50m in diameter to include the cairn and an area around it in which traces of activities associated with its use may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Assynt and the County of Sutherland as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects described in the Disposition by General Sir Herbert Alexander Lawrence and others in favour of Ronald Arthur Vestey dated 13, 18 and 19 December 1935 and 3 January 1936 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Sutherland on 30 January 1936 (the present owner whereof being Edmund Hoyle Vestey, Little Thurlow Hall, Haverhill, Suffolk), is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

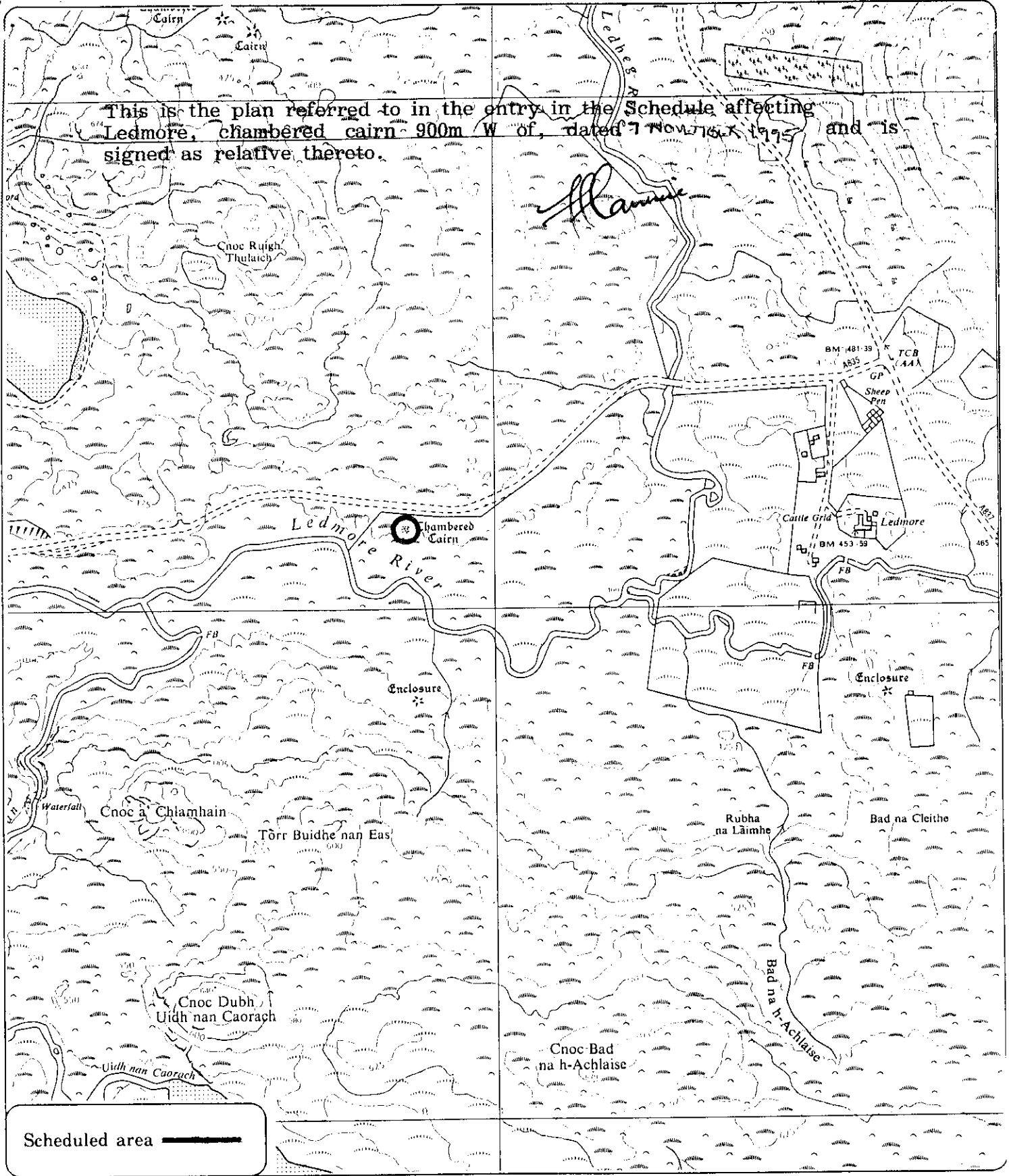

Scheduled area

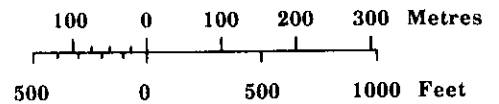
Ledmore, chambered cairn
