the owner of the Monument known as Ardvreck Castle (in ruins) situated on the neck of a peninsula known as Airde Bhreac extending westward from the north-east shore into Loch Assynt, said Castle being 110 yards south-east of the northmost point of said peninsula, 250 yards south-west of the bridge carrying the Lochinver-Inchnadamph road over the Allt a Chalda Beag and 450 yards west-north-west of the bridge carrying said road over the Allt a Chalda Mor

being the subjects indicated in red colour on the annexed plan and being part of the property known as Kirkton Farm, Estate of North Assynt

situated in the Parish of Assynt and

County of Sutherland

In accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the Ancient Monuments Act, 1931, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Works and Public Buildings hereby give you notice that it is their intention to include the Monument above specified in a list of monuments to be published by them under Section 12 of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913.
