"(NC 9531 1861) Hut Circle." (1).
 "A circular stone-walled hut circle." (2).
 (OSFI:WDJ:13.5.1960).
 "The hut circle, levelled into a low slope near the bottom of a south-facing hillside, is about 6.5m in internal diameter. The wall, robust and heather-overgrown, expands in estimated width from 1.7m in the NW arc to 3.5m at an entrance gap in the SE; it stands to an average 0.5m in height. Contemporary agriculture is shown by a scattering of stone clearance heaps along the hillside to the E, previously noted as 'The remains of several mounds' (2): field plots as such are not discernible."
