Monument known as Lybster Church, cross incised stone in the County of Caithness being the Monument described in the Certificate of Service of Notice by Commissioners of H.M. Works dated 20 March 1940 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Caithness on 8 October 1940.

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Lybster Church, cross incised stone comprises a rough boulder inscribed with an equal armed cross formed by a double border. The border is roughly 1m long and 0.4m wide by 0.4m high. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Latheron and the County of Caithness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects described in the Disposition by Trustees for the Congregation worshipping in the Church of Lybster in favour of Trustees under deed of Constitution for Church and Parish quoad sacra of Lybster dated 12 April and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Caithness on 19 April both in the year 1887 (the present owner whereof being The Congregational Board of Lybster Church, Lybster, Caithness), is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

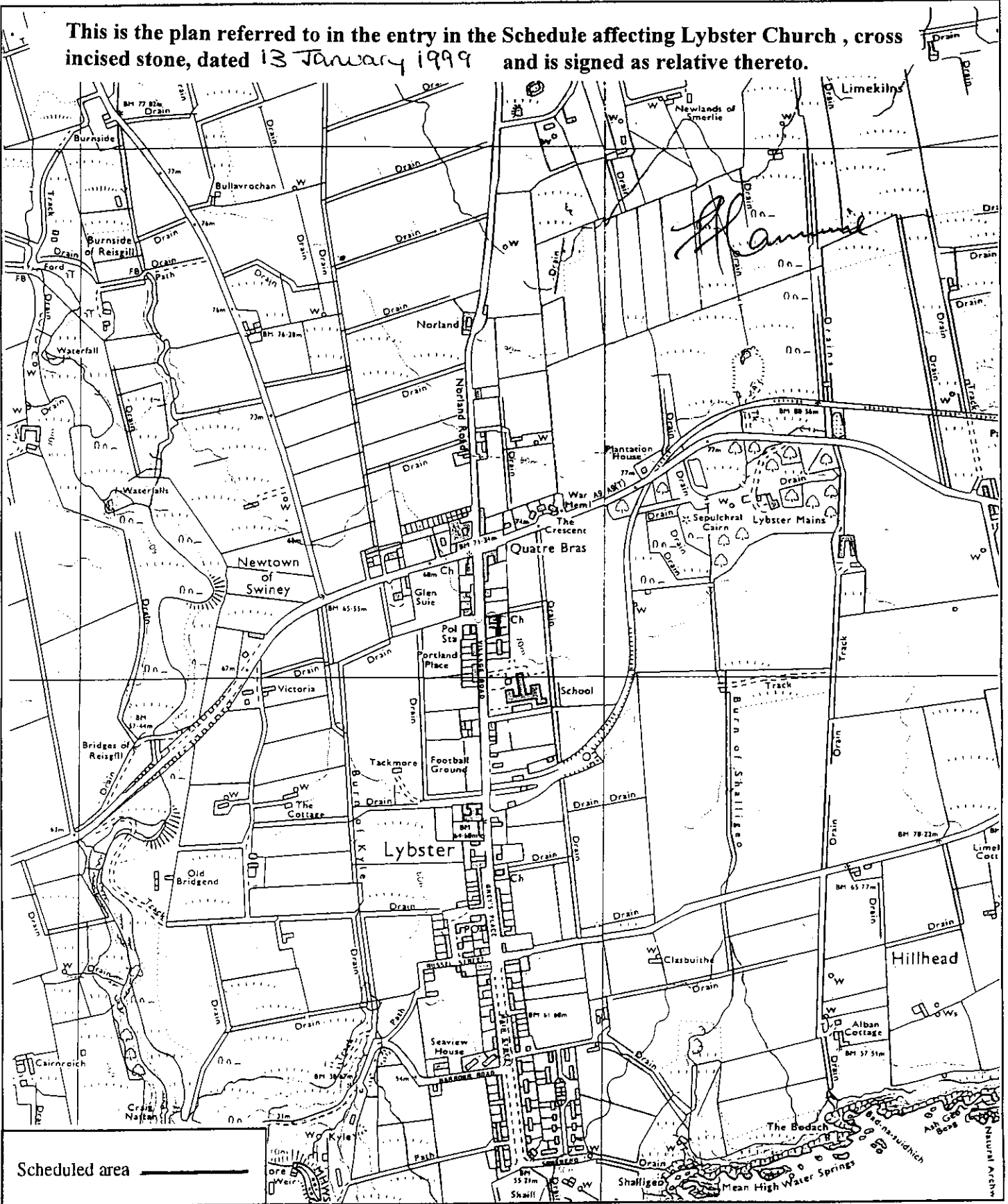

Scheduled area

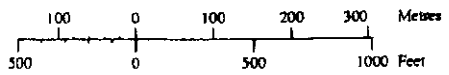
Lybster Church, cross incised stone

In accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the Ancient Monuments Act, 1931, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Works and Public Buildings hereby give you notice that it is their intention to include the Monument above specified in a list of monuments to be published by them under Section 12 of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913.

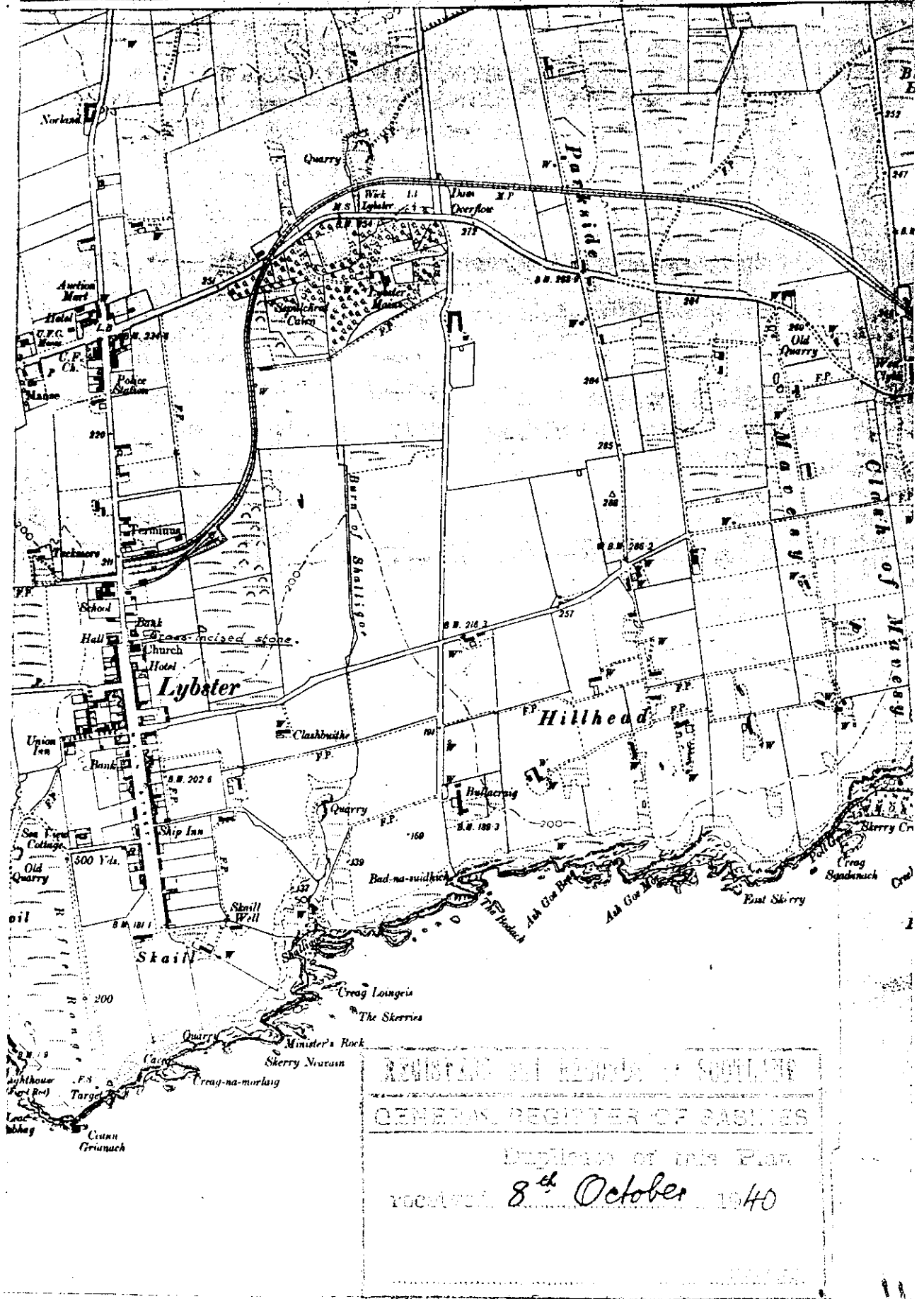

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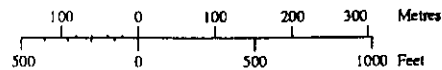

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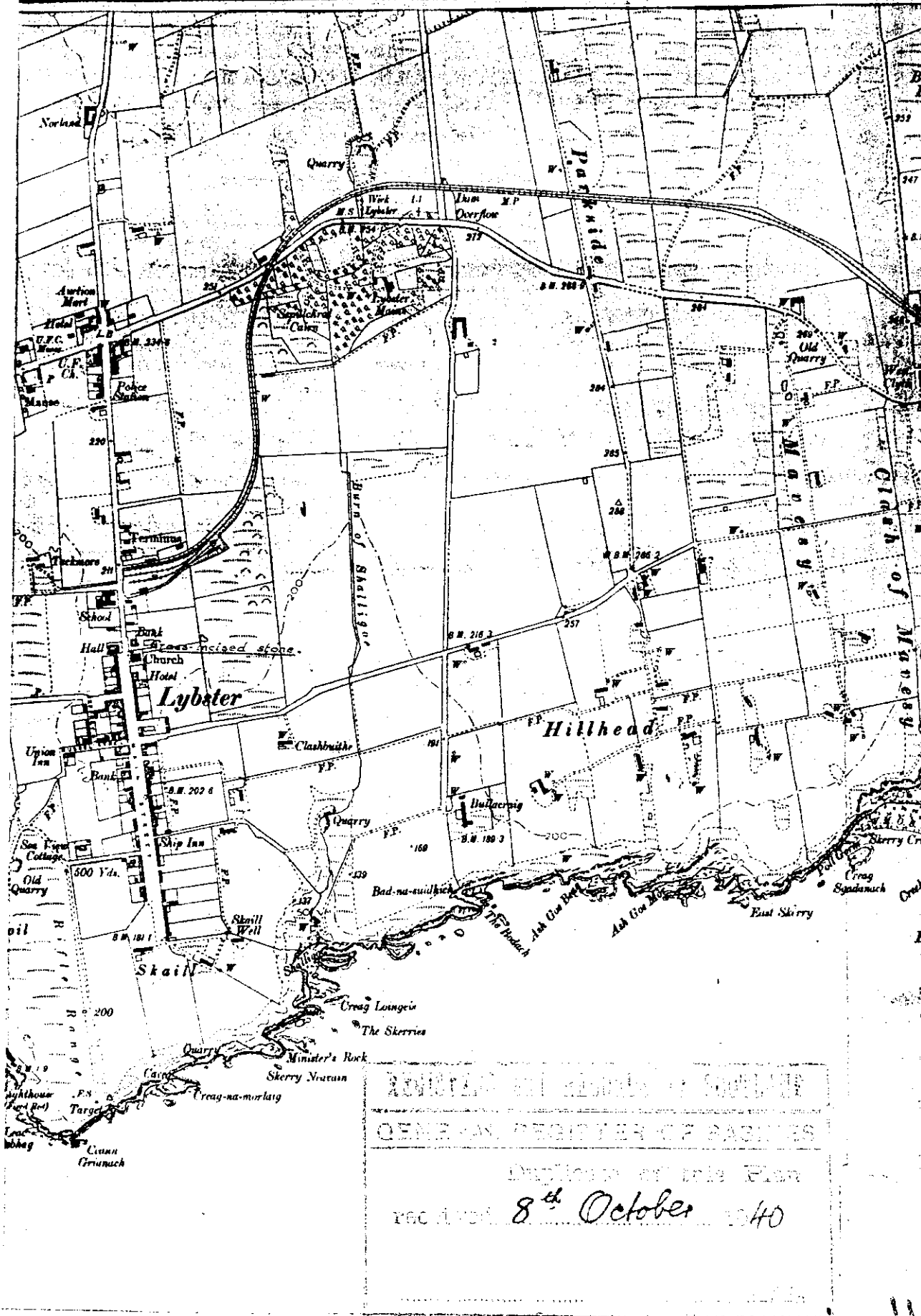
