"(ND 2075 3552) Usshilly Tulloch Broch." (I)

"The remains of a broch on a low, outcropping rock. Many large stones lie exposed over the surface, but the face of the wall is not well-defined, although the diameter appears to be about 64 ft(19.62m). The ruin is about 6 to 8 ft (1.83 to 2.44m) high and has been dug into on the E at some remote period. There are surface indications of outbuildings on all sides except the N."2

"A broch, as described by the RCAHM. It is now known locally as 'The Tulloch'."
