IN THE MATTER OF THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS ACTS, 1913 AND 1931.

To John Robson, Junior, Farmer, Lynegar, Watten, the owner of the Monuments known as the "Grey Cairn" (Broch or Mound) and the Cairn (or Mound) consisting of (First) the "Grey Cairn" occupying a circular area of ground measuring thirty yards in diameter, the south-most point of said area being situated fifty yards north by east of the Highland Railway now the London Midland and Scottish Railway at its nearest point on the north side of Loch Watten, five hundred and seventy yards south-east by south of the southmost corner of the buildings at Lynegar and six hundred and ninety yards south-south-west of the road between Georgemas and Wick at its nearest point and (Second) the Cairn (or Mound) occupying a circular area of ground measuring forty yards in diameter, the southmost point of said second-mentioned area being situated one hundred and eighty yards north-east of said road at its nearest point, two hundred and fifty yards east of the Bench Mark 128.4 on the west corner of the building on the north-east side of said road opposite the entrance to Lynegar and six hundred and seventy yards north-east by east of the eastmost corner of the buildings at Lynegar, being the subjects indicated in red colour on the annexed plan and being part of the property known as the Farm and lands of Lynegar situated in the Parish of Watten and County of Caithness.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the Ancient Monuments Act, 1931, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Works and Public Buildings hereby give you notice that it is their intention to include the Monuments above specified in a list of monumants to be published by them under Section 12 of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendments Act, 1913.


