"NG 517 513. Holm: described as a 'village', c.1695 (1) and shown as a township by Johnson in 1824 (2) but totally deserted by 1875. (3)" (OSFI:AC:19.12.1960) "Holm consists of two distinct depopulated townships. The later settlement, at NG 518 517, is a sheep farm. There is a large ruined house of mortared rubble masonry standing to the height of the gable at the E end, which is surrounded by about 8 ruined houses. A considerable area of cleared land is visible round about but no run-rig, and to the S there is a large sheepfold. (See also HNG 55 SW 001)." (OSFI:AC:29.4.1961)
