being the subjects indicated in red colour on the annexed plan and being part of the property known as part of the Macdonald Estates

situated in the Parish of Strath and County of Inverness.

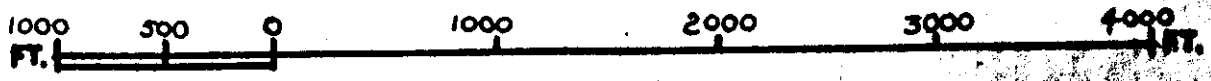



AMENDED ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The entry in the Schedule of monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the above Act in respect of the monument known as Caisteal Maol (Castle Moyle) Kyleakin, Skye, dated 10 November 1953 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Inverness on 27 November 1953 is hereby in accordance with the provisions of section 1(5) of the above Act amended to describe the area of the scheduled monument as measuring approximately 60m WSW-ENE by 50m as shown delineated in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto. The electrical fittings (but not the housings or cable runs) of the floodlights, and the bench and interpretation board to the W of the tower are excluded.

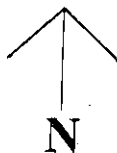


Scheduled area

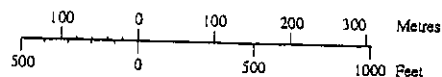
Caisteal Maol (Castle Moyle), Kyleakin, Skye

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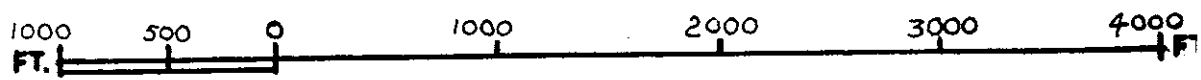
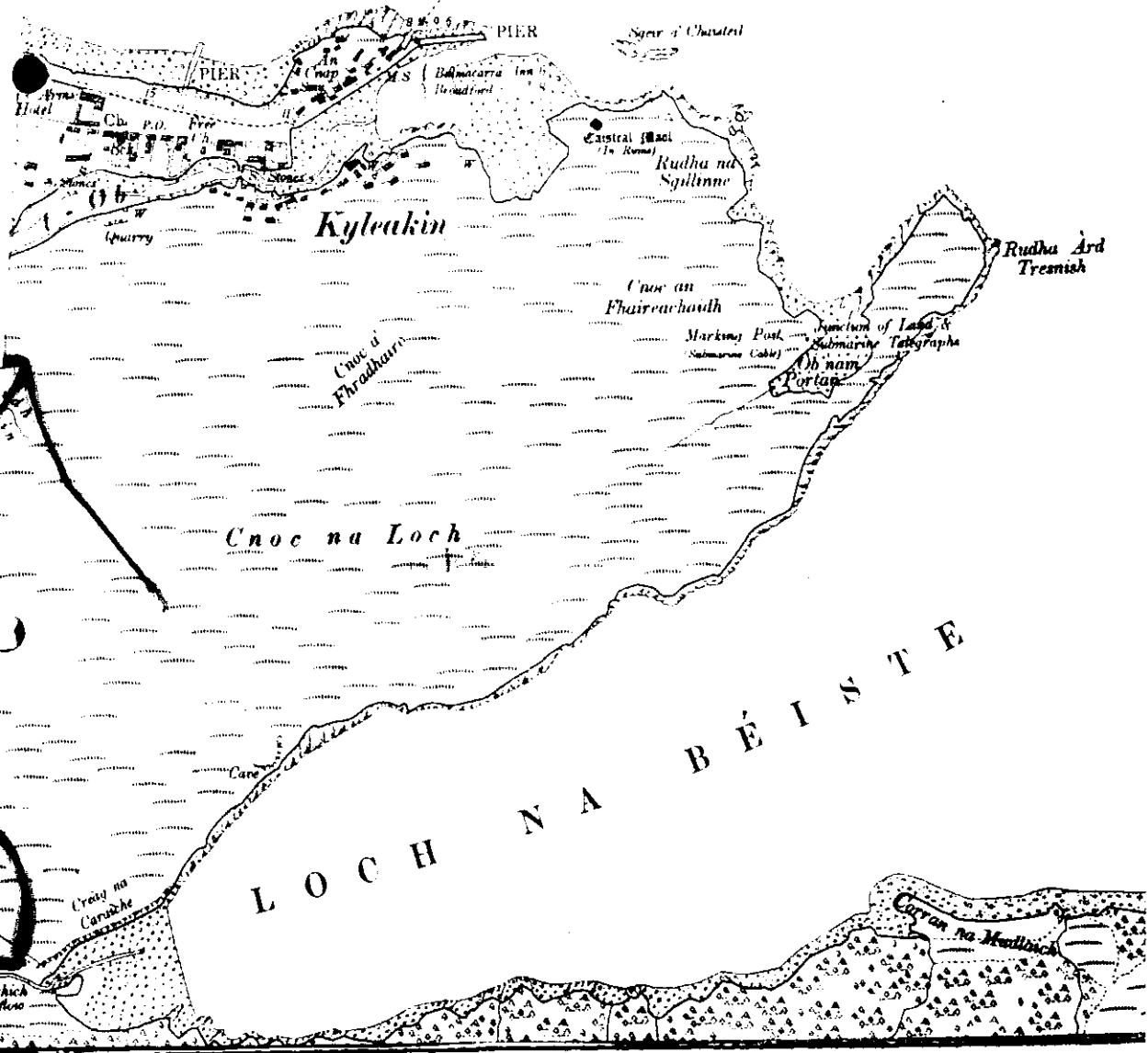
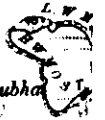
