"NH 5117 4175 Uaigh Gillechunne. Stone Coffin containing two urns found AD 1763. (NAT)" (1)

"Uamh Gillichuinne is a stone coffin only the sides of which now remain. Two urns filled with ashes were found in it in 1763. Tradition does not say who Gillichuinne was." (2)

"Uaigh Gillechunne: The remaining stones of the coffin were removed for use in the building of the older part of the present manse." (3)

"No trace exists. No further information." (OSFI: JB: 25.7.1975)
