A cup marked, Class I symbol stone, which had been used as a lintel over a doorway of the church built in 1801, was identified in 1880 and is now erected on a base in the churchyard opposite the entrance gateway.

It is a rectangular slab of mica schist, 4'3" high by 1'8" wide by 8" thick, bearing on the front the double disc and Z-rod, and two crescent and V-rods; and on the back three circles and the crescent and V-rod as well as six cup marks. (See Illustration)

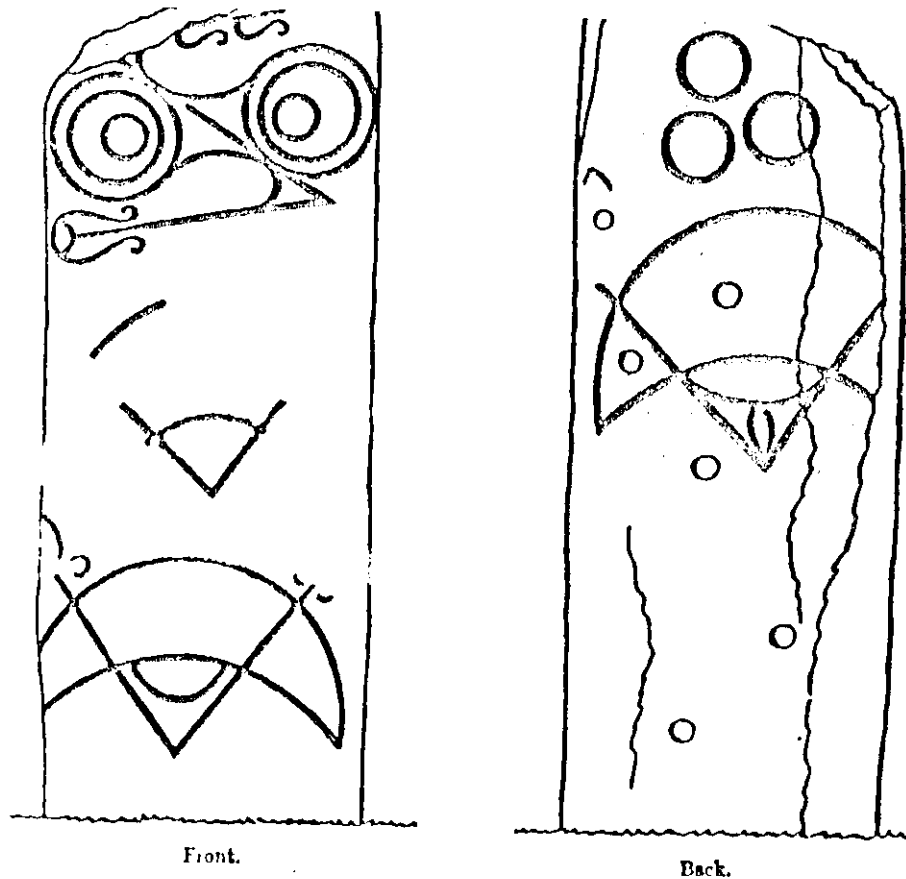


Fig. 55.—Stone sculptured with incised symbols at Dingwall. Scale, $\frac{1}{8}$ linear.
