 "On the NE slopes of Black Hill, at 650ft(198m) OD, there are two cup-marked stones at NH 5737 6370 and NH 5738 6376."(1) " 'A' is a large flat stone, 1.7m x 1.0m, flush with the ground, with about 40 cup-marks, 1 cup-and-ring mark and 2 cup-marks joined by a groove. This is clearly the stone referred to in (1). 'B' is an irregular-shaped boulder, 1.5m long, 0.8m wide and 0.5m high, on which about 15 cup-marks are visible. This may be the stone described by Macrae."(2) "Cup marked Rock (twice). NH 5737 6371, cup marked rock, NH 5738 6376, cup marked rock."(3) "Stone 'A' has approx. 37 plain cup-marks, 1 cup and ring, one 'dumbell', and concentrated at its N end 10 'scoops' appearing as enlarged cups, sub circular in plan. Two faint grooves form a cross shape on the stone surface. The stones are otherwise as described above."(OSFI:JB:18.11.1976)
