 "Hut 'A' - NH 5134 6134, Hut 'B' - NH 5146 6128, Hut 'C' - NH 5147 6137, Hut 'D' - NH 5155 6135."
 "NH 5134 6134. Enclosure." (1) "In an area of rough grazing and recent cultivation is a settlement of four circular stone-walled huts (A-D). Hut 'A', published on the OS map as an enclosure, measures about 12.0m in diameter within a wall, which is mutilated on all but the N side of the entrance in the SE, where it is spread to about 3.0m. The inner face is visible intermittently in the S, E and W arcs, and probable displaced facing stones lie within the hut. A field wall extends from the S side of the entrance as far as a later track to the SE of the hut. 'B', set into the E side of a low ridge is about 17.5m between the centres of a mutilated wall spread to about 4.0m all round. The ill-defined entrance is in the SE arc. Modern clearance has been piled within the hut against the E arc. 'C' is visible as a platform, about 12.0m in diameter, scarped into the SW slopes of the same ridge. All that can be seen of the encircling wall are two stones.....

52. in the W, where the hut is mutilated. The position of the entrance is no longer apparent. 'D' is about 13.0m in diameter between the centres of a denuded wall of indeterminate thickness. The ill-defined entrance is in the E. In the vicinity of the huts are traces of contemporary field walls, largely obscured by later cultivation."(OSFI:NKB:1.7.1965) (OSFI:ISS:22.5.1973)
