

IN THE MATTER OF THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS ACTS,
1913 and 1931.

To Mrs. Louise Whitfield Carnegie of Skibo, Skibo Estate
Offices, Clashmore, Sutherland, the owner of the Monument
known as the Standing Stone situated in a field ninety yards
west by south of the road between Bonar Bridge and Inveran at
its nearest point, one hundred and eighty yards north-west by
north of the sign post at the junction of the east side of said
road with the west-north-west side of the road to Lairg Station
and two hundred and seventy yards east-north-east of the north-
east corner of the farmhouse at Invershin Mains,

being the subjects indicated in red colour on the annexed plan and being part of
the property known as the Farm and lands of Invershin
situated in the Parish of Creich and
County of Sutherland.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the Ancient Monuments
Act, 1931, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Works and Public Buildings
hereby give you notice that it is their intention to include the Monument above
specified in a list of monuments to be published by them under Section 12 of the
Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913.

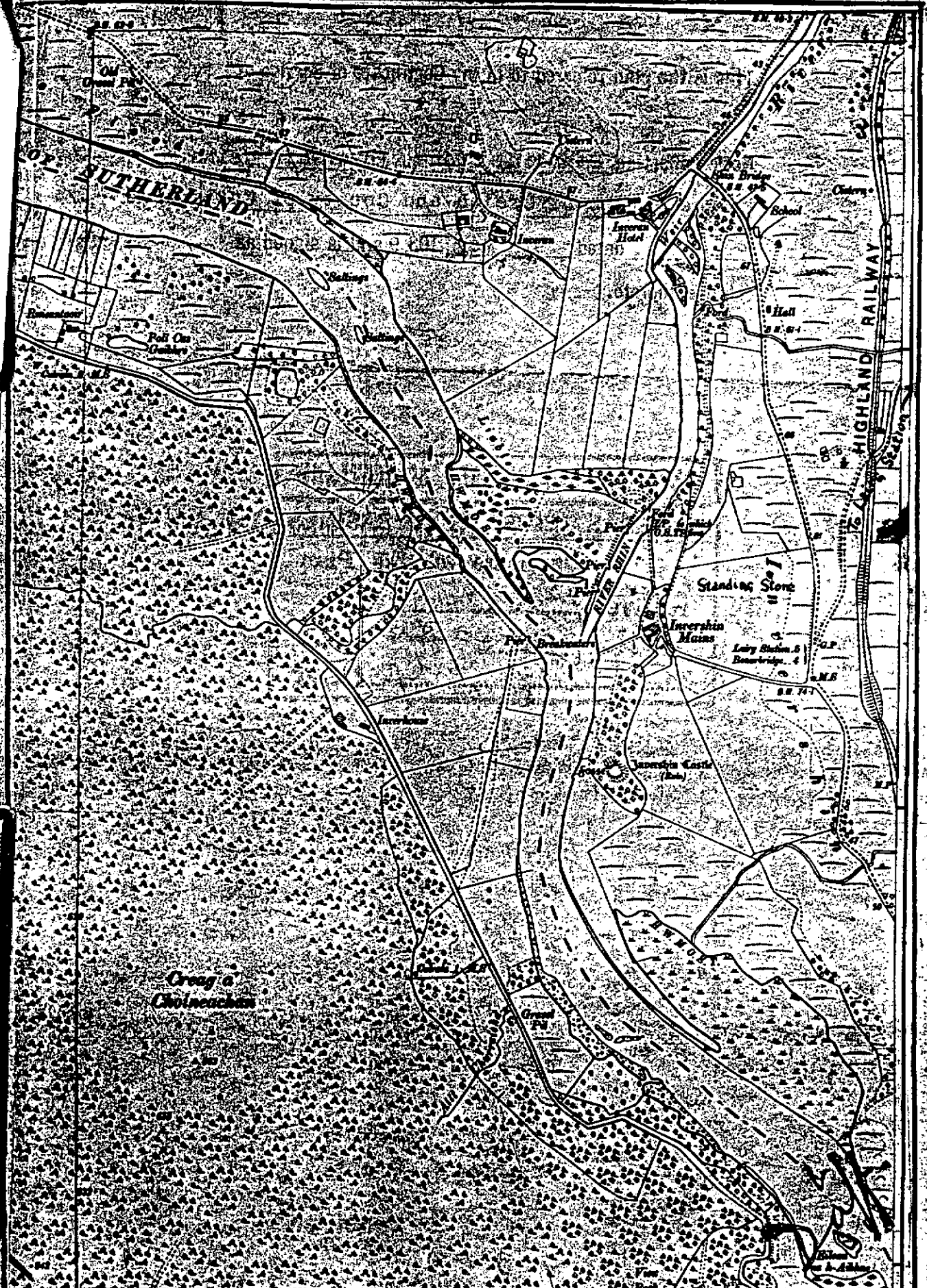
