

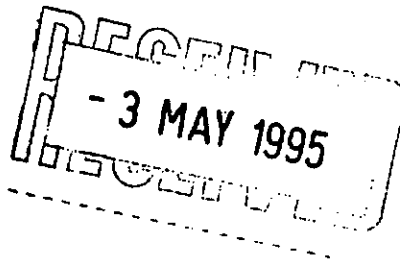

Dear Mr Wood,

I have a very amateur interest in antiquities - I often visit INVERSHIN, where my wife originates, and I find arrogant abuse of our valuable heritage.

1. At Invershin farm, the farmer has, with a JCB, removed 2 of 3 magnificent standing stones. (He tried to pull-out the main one, but it was too deeply rooted!).

2. An ancient burial chamber is being sold as a BUILDING SITE, at Dungarvia.

3. Ancient holding pools, at an old Salmon netting station on the Kyle, below the FARRIER, K. HEDLEY, have been ruined by dumping massive rock lumps from a road "improvement".

This area is designated an SSSI. The contempt shown to our local history and artifacts is unacceptable.

Please investigate!
