

Description. The cairn has been placed on a small natural rise at 150ft. OD, in arable land 1 mile E of the River Ness. It is now at the edge of a patch of thin woodland. It has been so completely robbed that only a few stones of the peristalith remain in situ, and a few more stones lie where they have fallen outwards from their original positions. The stones are considerable rounded boulders set on end, four of them contiguous. They vary in height from 1ft. 9 in. to 4ft., the tallest being in the middle of the existing setting. There can be little doubt that they represent part of the s arc of a cairn kerb though they are not arranged on a true circle. On the 6 in. Os map of 1871 the site is marked as an almost complete circle lacking only part of the w side.
