
THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS ACTS, 1913 AND 1931

To Peter Arthur Chamberlain and Brenda Anne Chamberlain or MacCallum both residing at Millcraig, Alness, Ross and Cromarty, Owners of the Monument being a Chambered Cairn at Kinrive Wood known as the King's Head Cairn with its edge showing a diameter varying between 75 and 85 feet with a chamber constructed of large alabs standing clear and having 7 feet north west of the back of the chamber a cist with four side stones measuring 3 feet by 4 feet and 3½ feet deep, all as shown coloured red on the annexed plan, situated in Kinrive Wood and forming part of the three Farms of Easter Kinrive, Mid Kinrhive and Wester Kinrhive described in the Disposition granted by Kindeace Estate Company with consent therein mentioned in favour of John MacLennan and another dated 15th October and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Ross and Cromarty on 20th November 1955,



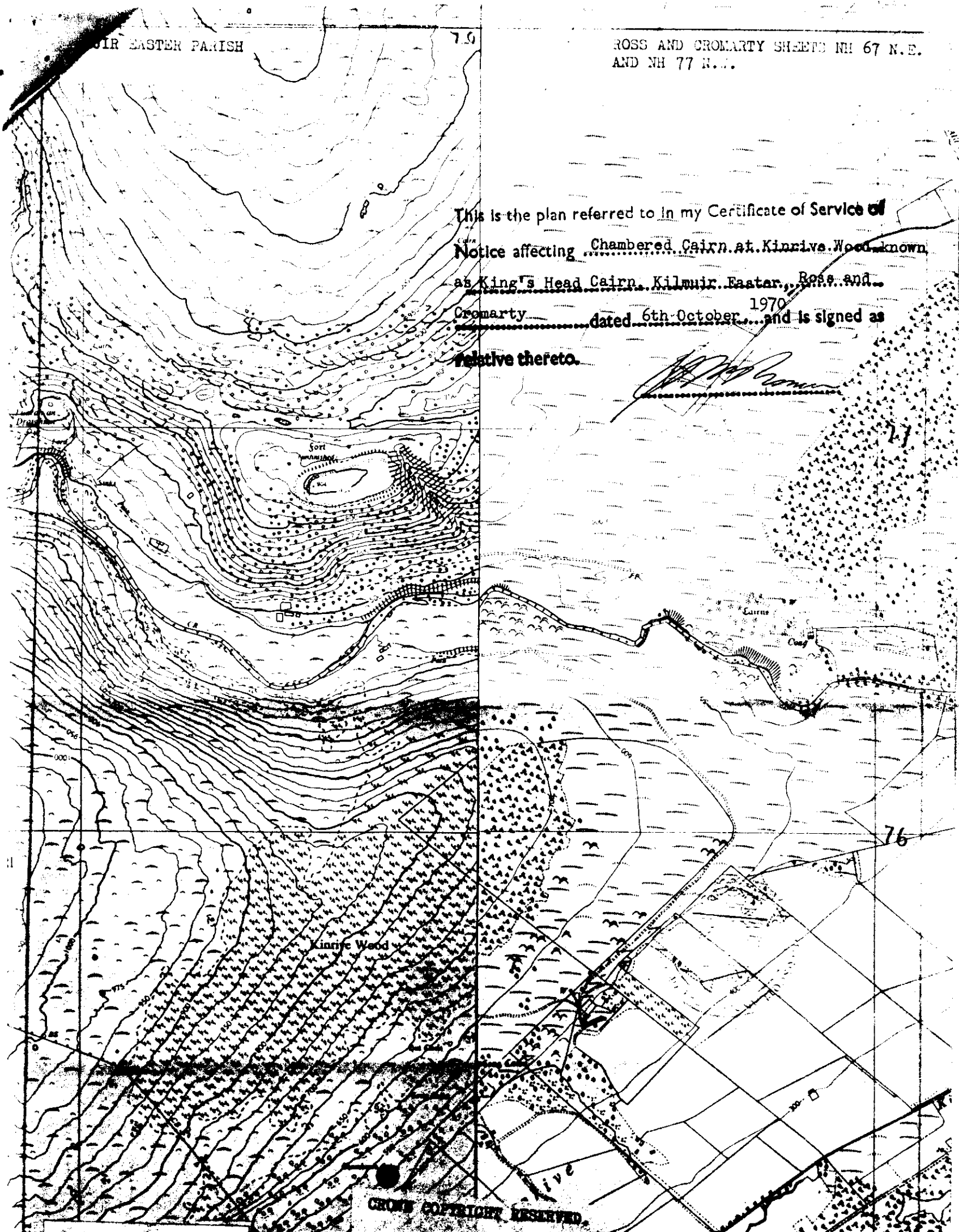
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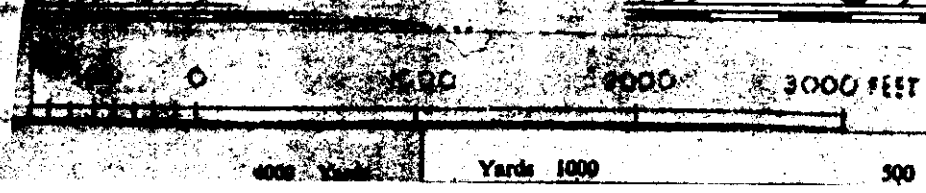
