 "NH 6536 7413. Cairn (remains of)." (1) "Stittenham: about 1/2 mile N of Dalnavie a large cairn was removed in 1847-8. It was 108' (33m) diameter and 20' (6.2m) high. In Sept. 1880 a search was made for the cist, which proved to be 8' (2.4m) long, 2 1/2' (1.3m) broad and 2' (0.6m) deep; laid in a grave 12' (3.7m) long, 7' 9" (2.3m) wide and 8' (2.4m) deep; and surrounded and covered with stones to a height of 5' (1.5m) from the bottom. The whole was covered with earth. The body was wholly decomposed. A few pieces of decayed oak, suggested a coffin. The only relics were three beautifully formed arrowheads, and a thin circular piece of shale about 2" (50.8mm) diameter, apparently an ornament. The three barbed arrowheads of light-grey flint were donated to Nat. Mus. Ants. Scot. by Sir Alexander P Matheson." (2) (3) "NH 6536 7413. Cairn." (4)

"All that remains of the cairn is a small mutilated mound of earth and stones 0.9m high situated almost in the centre of a circular area of ground c42m in diameter, containing the stumps of cut-down fir trees and a scatter of stones. The small mound is 13m in diameter with a circular depression c6.0m in diameter in its centre. It is now not possible to determine the original diameter of the cairn."(OSFI:WDJ:8.5.1963)
