An English elm, standing in front of Culloden House, in which is fixed a brangas, or iron holdfast, in which in feudal times, it was customary to padlock the arm or leg of any malefactor." (2) "The tree has been felled and its roots pulled out. A stone, 1.5m high and bearing an inscription, has been erected on the site. In Inverness Museum are the Jougs and part of the tree mentioned by (2)." (OSFI:EGC:25.4.1962)
