"NH 72114648 "Culloden House is built somewhat in the Castle way, and was the estate of the late President Forbes and now of his son." (1)

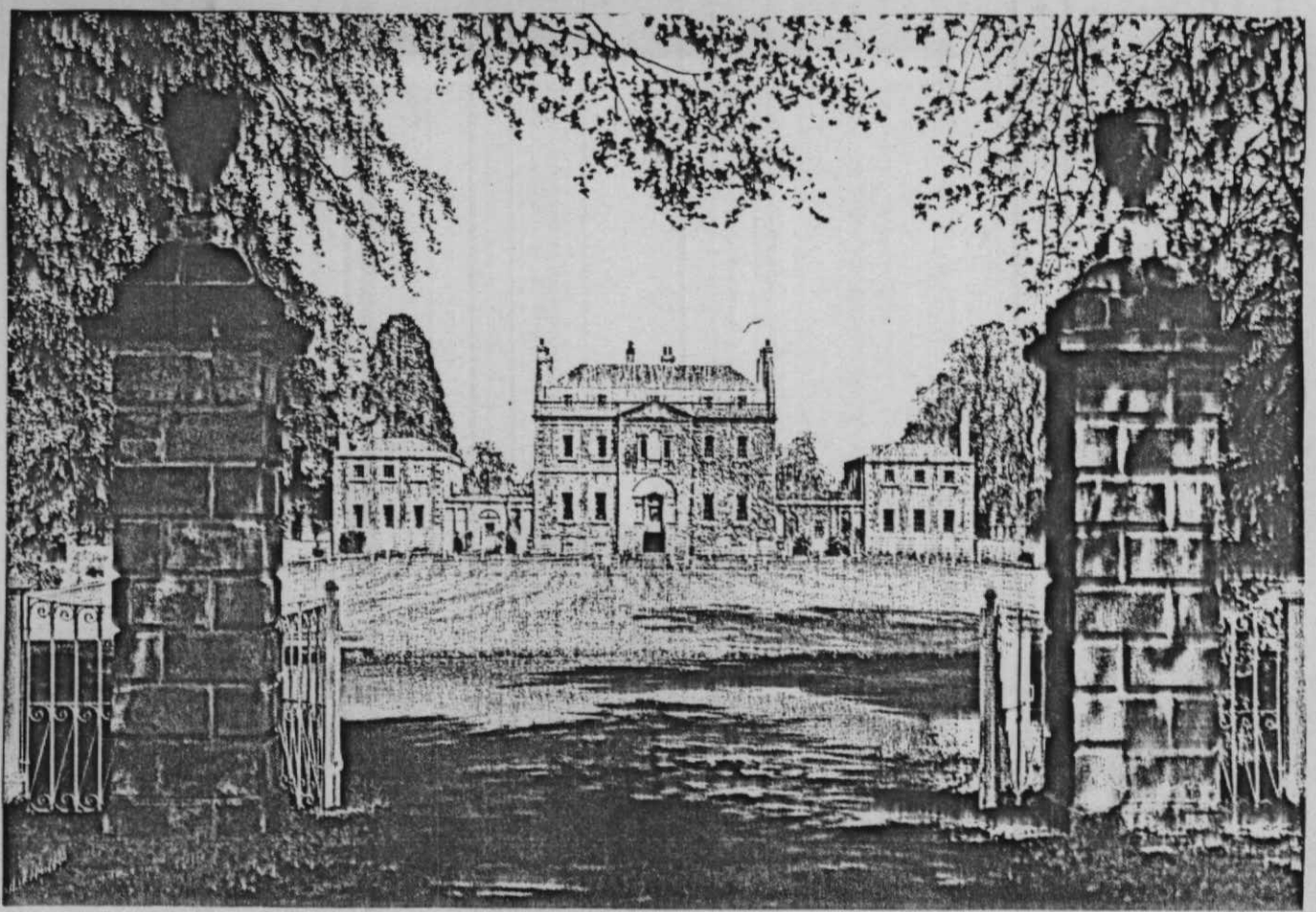
"The estate of Culloden was anciently provided with its own keep or tower." (2)

"The Laird of MacIntosh built a part of the House of Culloden in the 16th century. His successor sold it in 1626 to Duncan Forbes, Provost of Inverness." (3)

"Culloden House, a plain structure, consists of a three-storeyed centre block with two storeyed wings. According to the caretaker, Bonnie Prince Charlie stayed there before the Battle of Culloden, after which the building was burnt down. Its date is c. 1790" (OSFI:EGC:25.4.1962)
