"NH 8731 7687 Chapel (remains of)." (1) "At Hilton of Cadboll, a chapel dedicated to the Virgin 'Our Lady's Chapel' is mentioned in 1610. Within an earthwork enclosure traces of a chapel structure are clearly visible in the form of a small rectangular walled building. The direction is due E-W, some 30° athwart its surrounding earthwork. It was from this site that the Cadboll Stone (NH 87 NE 007) was removed. In association with the chapel was a well called 'Oure Lady-Well' situated near the angle of the Kail-yard dyke." (2)(3)(4) "The turf-covered remains of this chapel measure 12.0m E-W by 6.5m. No entrance is evident. Attached to the W gable is a semi-circular enclosure which probably housed the 'Cadboll Stone' before it was removed. The chapel stands within a sub-rectangular enclosure bounded by a ruinous turf-covered wall, which has at one time been extended to the NE and SE. This has presumably been the burial ground, but there are no signs of headstones. A broken font lies in the burial ground immediately N of the chapel. There is no trace of the well."
