"NM 9817 9142. Tigh nan Saighdearan (old Barracks)."(1) "Tigh nan Saighdearan (The Soldiers' House) ruins of old barracks built by the Government at the time of the Jacobite Rebellion, 1745. Although not easily recognised, remains of the 'firmly built walls' are still standing."(2)(3) "Tigh nan Saighdearan, built into the shoulder of a hill, is a simple rectangular building measuring 8.9m N-S by 4.1m E-W, within a rubble wall bonded with shell mortar, 0.7m thick. The N gable, where there is a rectangular window aperture, survives to a max. height of 2.2m, but elsewhere it is reduced to its base courses. The remains of a fireplace are visible in the S gable."(OSFI: NKB:11.5.1970) "NM 9817 9142 Tigh nan Saighdearan, remains of barracks(1745)."(4)
